Construction has begun!



The Numbers . . .

The township is set to receive \$524,603.15 from our insurance company to replace the building. The approved bid from Northeast Buildings LLC is \$548,000. This was the only bid within 10% of the adjusted Engineer's estimate of \$500,000. The difference will be paid out of existing Township funds. The new building will be a 6 bay, 62' x 132' building totaling 8,258 sq. ft. and be able to house all the township road department's vehicles and equipment.

- July 15th, 2016 Fire
- October 2016 Tim Martin, County Engineer, offers county outpost garage on Route 84 for township
 use until new building is up
- April & May 2017 Trustees review different building designs
- June 14th, 2017 Proof of Loss Statement verifying replacement value
- **December 20**th, **2017** Trustee-elects briefed on project
- January 10th, 2018 Final plans presented and ready for County Engineer's evaluation and bid estimate
- February 14th, 2018 Bid estimate received and Dave Payne approved as Construction Manager
- March 29th, 2018 The project was put out for bid and packets were distributed to interested parties.
- April 16th, 2018 Bids were opened and reviewed. A total of 5 bids were received ranging from \$548.000 to \$833.000
- April 25th, 2018 Initial approval of Northeast Buildings LLC, owner John Boczar's bid of \$548,000.
- June 2nd, 2018 Contract signed and finalized.
- June 13th, 2018 Construction started
- **December 14**th, **2018** Projected completion date per contract

Trustees have approved upgrades to ensure that the building will be a valuable resource long into the future. These include:

- Turning the building on the site to minimize its visual impact within the residential neighborhood.
- Upgrading the roof insulation from R19 to R25.
- Installing insulation and piping for a future radiant heat system.

Thank you . . . Plastpro Inc for donating the insulation panels that will be installed as part of the future radiant heat system. This amounts to a \$11,000 cost savings for the township.
