



Introducing the new Fire Chief ...

On May 14th, 2019, the Trustees hired Mr. Jesse A. Sopko as the new Kingsville Township Fire Chief. Mr. Sopko is a certified Firefighter II and EMT-Paramedic.

Mr. Sopko currently works for the City of Mentor Fire-Rescue Division and the Madison Fire District. Starting June 3rd, he will be the full-time chief for Kingsville working 40 hours a week and continue to work a shift for Mentor.

In his short career, he has attained many skills including Haz-Mat training, reviewing fire department policies, procedures, and regulations and assisting with budgets for fire department services, equipment, and apparatus.

The Numbers . . . Mr. Sopko is only **21** years old but has gained extensive experience working for busy departments like Mentor and Madison. Last year he went on **1,015** EMS calls. That is **320** more than the entire Kingsville department went on in 2018 (**695** EMS calls). He responded to **11** structure fires versus Kingsville's **3**. He also has experience dealing with incidents along major interstates like I-90, responding to **42** calls along I-90 and State Route 2 in 2018 versus Kingsville's **28** calls to I-90.
